- Author, recipient, greeting
- Expanded into a Christian form
- Lays a foundation for what follows

#### **Answers three questions:**

- 1. What authority does the letter bear?
- 2. What response is it intended to produce?
- 3. What is the basis of that response?

- What authority does the letter bear?
  - Paul
  - Slave of God God's representative
  - Apostle of Jesus Christ Witness to and preacher of the gospel

- What response should the letter produce?
  - Faith belief, trust, faithfulness
  - Knowledge of the truth that produces godliness understanding of the gospel and its outworking
  - Hope of eternal life expectation of sharing God's life

- What is the basis of that response?
  - God's commitment to give eternal life
  - Fulfilment of his promise in the gospel...
  - and in Paul's commission to proclaim it

- Trans-local leaders like Titus share some of Paul's authority and ministry
- Greeting is for favour and harmony/well-being...
- ...from God and Christ in their saving plan

- Titus is to address matters outstanding...
- ...and principally to appoint local leaders
- This task is for trans-local leaders

- Elders: senior men, heads of households, often older
- Overseer: governs congregations teaching,
   care, discipline
- Steward: God's faithful representative in the
   'household' of the church

- Characteristics of local leaders:
  - Moral qualities: godly character and conduct
  - Ministry qualifications: sound belief and leadership gifts

- Moral qualities:
  - Expected of all church members
  - Essential for leaders
  - Family responsibilities + general vices and virtues
  - Reflect society's higher values
  - (Listed on slides 15-17)

- Ministry qualifications:
  - Right belief hold fast to the gospel
  - Instruct and direct in apostolic teaching
  - Refute and rebuke its opponents

- Apostolic teaching:
  - Settled body of truth authorised by God
  - Generates good qualities and brings eternal life
  - Leaders are tasked with holding to it and using it

- Church must protect correct doctrine and resist heresy...
- ...and maintain appropriate conduct and reject immorality
- Primarily the task of leaders

#### MORAL QUALITIES (1) FAMILY

- Of good reputation, not accused of misbehaviour, e.g. ...
- Faithful to his wife
- Children are believers...
- and do not lack self-control or moderation, or disregard authority

#### MORAL QUALITIES (2) VICES

- Not arrogant, overbearing
- Not inclined to anger, quick-tempered
- Not addicted to wine, drunken
- Not a violent bully, pugnacious person
- Not pursuing dishonest gain

#### MORAL QUALITIES (3) VIRTUES

- Hospitable, to e.g. visiting preachers, believers in need, worship gatherings
- Selflessly pursuing inherently good things and people
- Self-controlled in thinking and consequent behaviour, prudent, judicious
- Upright, just, in dealings with others
- Pure and holy before God, devout
- Disciplined regarding the body and its desires
